Inflatable Pillows for Tunnel Stabilization

Dr. Henn will present the results of his recent Ph.D research, which focused on inflatable pillows for tunnel stabilization. Engineering and technical advancements in earth pressure balance and slurry shield tunnel boring machines, precast concrete segments, and segment gasketing systems have allowed for tunneling in environments with increasingly higher ground water pressures. However, these advancements have created a new problem, high pressure flowing water in the annulus between the excavating rock and outside face of the segment ring. These flowing water conditions can make backfilling of the annulus difficult and sometimes impossible. This presentation discusses two systems to help mitigate problems of backfilling associated with flowing water in the annulus. One system is an inflatable circumferential dam and the other is an inflatable segment support pillow system. While these systems were developed specifically for use with tunnel boring machine excavated rock tunnels lined with precast concrete segments, the systems are being reviewed for additional uses to aid in the construction processes of conventionally excavated soft ground and rock tunnels and shafts which employ a "two pass" lining system requiring backfilling of the annulus. An example is a steel or precast concrete carrier pipe installed in an initially supported rock or soft ground tunnel. Dr. Henn's presentation will include a "show-and-tell" session with examples of the various support elements.


Section Meetings. -- We are investigation the possibility of having section meetings in
